Tim Chikati – 52/2023 MCA) to seek a response from the CECM, Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries, Irrigation and Cooperative Development in respect to the following cattle dips within Ndalu-Tabani Ward; Mayende cattle dip, Tabani cattle dip, Mapera cattle dip, Nzoia cattle dip, Muliro cattle dip and Luvitsu cattle dip

The CECM to respond to the following:

 Provide information as to why the foregoing cattle dips have stalled and/or are not in operation even after award of the contract to renovate them.

- 2. Provide the name and/or identity of the contractor awarded the tender for the renovation.
- 3. Provide the procurement documents (tender advert, quotation or tender opening and evaluation reports, contract agreement, opinion of the procurement officer in accordance with the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015) for the renovation of the aforementioned cattle dips.
- 4. Provide the procurement plan encompassing the said renovations in accordance with Section 44 (2) of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015.
- 5. State whether there was a budgetary provision for the renovations in accordance with Section 44 (2) (a) of the Public Procurement an Asset Disposal Act, 2015; and if yes, state how much.
- 6. Provide information and or a conclusive report as to whether the said cattle dips were handed over by the contractors to the County Government. How much was paid and how much is the balance?

1. What is the term of service of the municipality board members who took over office in 2017 and more so shade light on their years of service?

If the term of the said board members is renewable and elaborate more on their curriculum vitae and the period remaining for each member to serve on the board.

- 2. If there any vacancies that might have been availed due to members resignation and if in affirmative, the evidence of resignation.
- 3. Is there any board member currently serving or any member who contested in the 2022 general elections but still serving, if yes: their names and if they were cleared by IEBC and EACC as per the law.
- 4. Is there any board who contested in the last general elections and still sits on the board to date?

Question No 58/2023 Member for Musikoma Ward (Hon. George Makari-MCA) to seek a response from the CECM, Agriculture, livestock, Fisheries, Irrigation and Cooperative development in respect to what the department is doing about Namasanda Dam.

- 2. What is the name of the contractor; attach the CR 12 and a signed contract?
- 3. What was the contractual period? Has it expired or not, if expired, avail an extension authority?
- 4. Is the project complete as markings have been made; if not complete, what is the status?
- 5. Does the project has the contract implementation committee (CIC); if it has, avail the CIC reports and payment status (Payment Certificates to be availed)
- 6. Has the project been done according to the required standards?
