COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR

Honourable Members, I have some communications to make:

1. COMMUNICATION ON COMMENCEMENT OF THE FOURTH SESSION

The first communication concerns this Fourth Session of the Assembly. I stand before you today at the commencement of the Fourth Session of the Third County Assembly, marking the midway point of the Third County Assembly period that commenced in 2022.

QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS

Mr. Speaker: At this juncture Honourable Members, let us allow the area MCA, representing Elgon Ward to make remarks concerning the visiting entourage of the school who are in the gallery. The Hon. George Tendet Member for Elgon.

Hon. George Tendet: Thank you Hon. Speaker Sir. I want to thank God first for the journey mercies. They came all the way from the mountain to this place. I would like also to laud the assembly leadership for allowing the same school to visit for the second time. You remember last year this school visited and they are here again. I say thank once more for allowing them to come. This is the only school in my Ward which has visited this school twice. I thank the management of the school for doing that.

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Honourable Tendet, it has visited the Assembly not the school!

Hon. George Tendet: I am sorry. Thank you for that correction. I also want to thank the leadership of the school for this trip because it is not easy. You can remember this is their second time and other schools have not done the same. That tells me that the management of the school knows what it is doing because from here, these students will not be the same.

For the students, I would like to tell them that the secret of success is very simple if they can follow the following steps:

Put God First in everything you do. In your studies you need God. If God is not on your side things will go hay way.

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Thank you Hon. George Kwemoi Tendet for your remarks. A female Member of County Assembly to encourage the boys? Hon. Rugut, you can encourage the boys!

They are the only people who can celebrate when other children perform. So, whatever they say, take that seriously. We wish you God's blessings and for the teachers, never tire doing good for these students. God bless you.

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Thank you Hon. Angeline Rugut for your remarks. Let me now welcome Hon. Jacob Psero Maruga to speak on behalf of the Chairperson Education Committee.

Hon. Jacob Psero: Mr. Speaker Sir, I want to take this opportunity on behalf of Education department and on behalf of the Chair Education Committee Hon. Otsiula to welcome Chemwesus High School, both the teachers and the students to this particular House. Welcome to this House. It is a House of respect, a House that is there to represent the people particularly at the ward level and the same time do oversight of the various activities and projects that we have within our County. Apart from that, this House also does legislation;

that is to say we make laws governing the various activities in this County and that is why these honourable Members are here.

I want to say that Chemwesu High School is a school I know very well. It's a school that came up when I was already a principal in Mt. Elgon, Principal of Moi High School Kaptama. We saw the growth of Chemwesu High school and I am happy that the school has grown fast.

Honourable Members, I want to inform you that this is a school that we depend on in the mountain. It's challenging some of the old schools and I am sure even last year the mean was above average. I may not be able to quote it now but I know it's one of the schools that performed well...

Thank you. I want to ask the teachers and the students, when you go back thank all the teachers, the Principal who is my former student at Toroso High School. Greet your Principal; tell him your teacher is doing well in the County.

For teachers who have come here today, this House has a number of teachers and let me mention a few starting with your area MCA. Your MCA is a former teacher and I am sure he might have taught some of you if not he might have taught some of the teachers who are present. I am happy that I sit close to him because he is a good man and he is also doing a good job in this House. Apart from him we have Hon. Allan sitted on the far end representing the youth. He is closer to you in terms of age so he has a lot to share with you outside this room.

We have Hon. Christine Mukhongo, the MCA of Kimilili one of senior teachers. She has done a good job and she is an important person in this House. I cannot forget the person that gave you pieces of advice Hon. Rugut who is on the far end, a former Principal of a prominent school in the Rift Valley. Your neighbour Chemion is also here. He was once a soldier who later became a teacher and now he is a legislator.

When you leave this place, ensure that you go back and double your effort because if you do not do it, maybe next time you might not get such opportunity to visit either this place or another place, do your best. Continue serving the name of Chemwesu well and be able to excel. We appreciate your coming and I want to believe you have learnt a lot here. When you go back, transfer the same message to your colleagues that you left at school.

Teachers, that is a noble job you are doing, keep it up and continue doing well. God will bless you one of these days. We assist God in his creation, He creates and we mould. We are doing an important job reason I left Kaptama moved to Cheptais and I am now here because of the good work I did as a Principal. As you go back home, greet your parents and I want to tell you that ask them to support your MCA because he is equal to the task.

God bless you, we shall be able to talk and meet outside this House maybe for a final word. Thank you.
