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1.0 FOREWORD

Pursuant to Section 5 (1) of the Office of the County Attorney Act, 2020 as read together with Section 4 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, His Excellency the Governor nominated **Edward Oringe Waswa** for appointment as the Bungoma County Attorney vide a letter dated 17th March, 2025, referenced CG/BGM/GVN/CA/VOL.1(023).

On Tuesday, 25th March, 2025 the Honourable Speaker of the County Assembly conveyed the Message from His Excellency the Governor to the House pursuant Section 7 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order No. 45 (1). The name of the nominee was committed to the Committee on Appointments for vetting and reporting to the House within twenty-one (21) sitting days; pursuant to Section 9 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order No. 208(4).

Subsequently, the Clerk of the County Assembly while complying with Section 7 (10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, placed an advertisement in the print media on Friday, 28th March, 2025; inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavits) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee as stipulated in Section 7 (10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

The advert further notified the public that the Committee on Appointments would conduct the approval hearing for the nominee on Monday, 7th April, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. This was in fulfilment of the provisions of Article 196 (1) of the Constitution, Section 7(5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order No. 56(3).



2.0 PREFACE

2.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

Section 14 (3) (a) of the County Governments' Act, 2012 provides that in considering any appointment for which approval of the County Assembly is required under the Constitution, an Act of Parliament or County Legislation; the appointment shall be considered by a Committee of the County Assembly.

The Committee on Appointments is therefore established under Standing Order No. 208(1). Standing Order No. 208(4) provides that the Committee on Appointments shall consider, for approval by the House, appointments under Article 179(2) (b) of the Constitution, Section 44 of the County Governments Act, 2012 and Section 5 (1) of the Office of the County Attorney Act, 2020.

3.0 BACKGROUND

3.1 Notification of Nomination

Pursuant to Section 5 (1) of the Office of the County Attorney Act, 2020 as read with Sections 4 and 6 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, His Excellency the Governor, forwarded to the Clerk of the County Assembly a letter dated 17th March, 2025, referenced CG/BGM/GVN/CA/VOL.1 (023), forwarding the name of the person nominated for appointment to the position of Bungoma County Attorney. The notification contained the curriculum vitae and testimonials of the nominee.

3.2 Notification to the House and Committal to the Committee on Appointments

The Speaker, in adhering to the provisions of Standing Order No. 45(1) and vide a communication dated Tuesday 25th March, 2025 informed the House of the Governor's message on nomination of a person to the position of Bungoma County Attorney.

Pursuant to Section 7(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order No. 56 (1), the name and curriculum vitae of the nominee was committed to the Committee on Appointments for approval hearing and reporting to the House within twenty-one (21) sitting days.

3.3 Notification to the Public

Article 196 of the Constitution provides that the County Assembly shall facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative business and other business of the County Assembly and its Committees.

Section 7 (5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 provides that the Committee shall notify the public of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven days prior to the hearing. Further, Section 7(10) of the Act, 2017 provides that;

“any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated.”

Pursuant to Article 196 of the Constitution as read with Section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the County

Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Friday, 28th March, 2025. The advertisement contained a notification inviting the public to submit memoranda by Wednesday, 2nd April, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. in conformity with Section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

Further, pursuant to Article 196 of the Constitution, Section 7 (5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order No. 56(3), the Clerk of the County Assembly notified the general public on Friday, 28th March, 2025 through the print media that the approval hearing of the nominee would be conducted on Monday, 7th April, 2025.

3.4 Notification to the Nominee

On Friday, 28th March, 2025, the Clerk of the County Assembly invited the nominee through print media to attend the approval hearing in accordance with Section 7 (4) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

3.5 Clearance and Compliance Requirements.

On the notice of appearance for the approval hearing, the Clerk of the County Assembly informed the nominee to provide Clearance and Compliance requirements from Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Credit Reference Bureau (CRB).

On 26th March, 2025, the Clerk of the County Assembly wrote to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) requesting for reports of the nominee on matters relating to ethics and integrity. Further on Thursday, 2nd April, 2025 the Clerk of the County Assembly wrote to the National Intelligence Service requesting for background information on the nominee.

On matters ethics and integrity, the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) vide a letter dated 7th April, 2025 referenced EACC.7/10/5 VOL XXXI (73), stated that it had neither opened any inquiry, undertaken any investigations pursuant to its mandate nor recommended prosecution against the nominee.

The National Intelligence Service (NIS) confirmed vide a letter dated 8th April, 2025 referenced BGM/NIS/POL F. 50/4 VOL. 1, submitted that the nominee is of good moral conduct and had no known criminal record and neither does he have an adverse report.

Further, the nominee availed before the Committee certified clearance copies issued on diverse dates as follows:

3.6 Issues for Consideration during the Approval Hearing

Section 7(8) and (9) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 provides that:

(8) An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background.

(9) The criteria specified in the schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate.

Additionally, Section 8 of the Act provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant House in relation to any nomination shall be:

(a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee

(b) any Constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question, and

(c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominees' abilities, experience and qualifications meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.

While conducting the approval hearing, the Committee was guided by the provisions of Section 7 (8) and (9) and Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

(a) Establishment of the office of the County Attorney

The office of the County Attorney is established pursuant to the Office of the County Attorney Act, 2020. Section 5 of the Act confers upon the Governor the power to appoint a County Attorney with the approval of the County Assembly. The Section further provides for the eligibility of appointment of such person thus:

(2) A person qualifies for appointment as County Attorney if such person—

(a) is an Advocate of the High Court of Kenya of at least five years standing; and

(b) meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution.

Section 6 (2) provides that the County Attorney shall hold office for a term of six years and enjoys the status and rank of a member of the County Executive Committee.

(i) Functions of the County Attorney

The provisions of Section 7 of the Office of the County Attorney Act, 2020 state that a County Attorney:

- a) is the principal legal adviser to the county government;
- b) shall attend the meetings of the county executive committee as an ex officio member of the executive committee;
- c) shall, on the instructions of the county government, represent the county executive in court or in any other legal proceedings to which the county executive is a party, other than criminal proceedings;
- d) shall advise departments in the county executive on legislative and other legal matters;
- e) shall negotiate, draft, vet and interpret documents and agreements for and on behalf of the county executive and its agencies;
- f) shall be responsible for the revision of county laws;
- g) may liaise with the Office of the Attorney-General when need arises; and
- h) shall perform any other function as may be necessary for the effective discharge of the duties and the exercise of the powers of the County Attorney.

(ii) Vacancy in the County Attorney's office

Vacancy shall arise in the circumstances contemplated under Section. 12 and 13 of the County Attorney Act as detailed below:

Section 12 provides that the County Attorney may resign from office in writing, addressed to the Governor.

Further, Section 13 outlines the procedure for removal from office thus:-

The Governor may, with the approval of the County Assembly, remove the County Attorney from office only for—

- (a) Serious violation of the Constitution or any other law;
- (b) Gross misconduct, whether in the performance of functions of the Office or otherwise;
- (c) Physical or mental incapacity to perform the functions of the Office;
- (d) Incompetence; or
- (e) Bankruptcy.

(b) Leadership and Integrity

The Committee, in determining the suitability of the nominee was guided by the provisions on leadership and integrity as outlined under Chapter Six of the Constitution. Article 73 (2) of the Constitution provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include:

73 (2)

- (a) selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability, or election in free and fair elections;
- (b) objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favouritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;
- (c) selfless service based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by
 - (i) honesty in the execution of public duties; and
 - (ii) the declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties
- (d) accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and
- (e) discipline and commitment in service to the people.

Article 75 of the Constitution requires a State Officer, whether in public or private life to behave in a manner that avoids conflict between personal interest and public or official duties. This Article further prohibits a State Officer who has been removed from office under it from holding any other State Office.

Article 77(1) of the Constitution prohibits a full time State Officer from participating in any other gainful employment.

Article 78 of the Constitution disqualifies persons who are not Kenyan Citizens from appointment as State Officers.

In addition, the Committee considered Section 10 of the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 in particular which provides that:-

A State Officer shall to the best of their ability:

- (a) carry out the duties of the Office efficiently and honestly;*
- b) carry out the duties in a transparent and accountable manner;*
- c) keep accurate records and documents relating to the functions of the office; and*
- d) report truthfully on all matters of the organization which they represent.*

(c) Suitability of the nominee with regard to the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities.

The suitability of the nominee was assessed after scrutiny of his academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity, background and individual qualities as well as his performance during the approval hearing conducted on Monday, 7th April, 2025.

3.7 Memoranda from members of the public in respect of the nominee

Pursuant to Section 7 (10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017:

“any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold office to which the candidate has been nominated.”

The Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Friday, 28th March, 2025 inviting the Public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in conformity with section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. In this regard, by Wednesday, 2nd April, 2025 at 9:00 a.m., the County Assembly had not received any Petition or memoranda.

3.8 Pre- Approval Hearing

During the pre-approval hearing, the Committee noted the following:

- (i) **THAT**, the nominee had not notified the Clerk of the County Assembly of his withdrawal from the approval process as outlined under Section 7(12) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

- (ii) THAT, the Committee would proceed with the approval hearing on Monday, 7th April, 2025.
- (iii) THAT, the Committee would examine the nominee against the criteria set out in Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017

3.9 Approval Hearing

The Committee conducted the approval hearing of the nominee on Monday, 7th April, 2025. The nominee, Edward Oringe Waswa was vetted under oath pursuant to the provisions of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and the County Assembly of Bungoma Standing Orders.

4.0 EDWARD ORINGE WASWA: NOMINEE FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE POSITION OF BUNGOMA COUNTY ATTORNEY

Edward Oringe Waswa, the nominee to the position of Bungoma County Attorney appeared before the Committee on Monday, 7th April, 2025 in the County Assembly Chambers. The Committee noted the following:

Citizenship, Date and Place of Birth

The nominee is a Kenyan male of ID NO 27731833 born on 24th February, 1990 in Nabiswa sub location, Kiminini Location in Trans Nzoia District as per his national Identity Card.

Academic and Professional Qualifications

The nominee has educational qualifications from different institutions as follows:

Work and Professional Experience

The nominee worked at various institutions and in different capacities:

He has worked as a personal Assistant to Senator James Orengo, EGH, MP, and SC from March, 2018 to August, 2022. He also served as an Associate at J.A.B Orengo Advocates from March, 2018 to October, 2022 and at Triple A Law, LLP from July to October, 2017.

He worked as a Legal Researcher with the National Super Alliance (NASA) from July, 2017 to January, 2018 and at Kitiwa & Company Advocates from September, 2013 to December, 2015.

From January to July, 2017, the nominee served as a Legal Assistant (Pupillage) at Kipkenda & Company Advocates and as a Legal Assistant at A.T Oluoch & Company from January to December, 2016.

As an intern, the nominee worked at Makadara Law Courts from May to July, 2013.

The nominee further worked at Nzoia Sugar Company, Bungoma as an Agronomy Field Analyst from November, 2010 to May, 2011; and at Raytech Computers and Photographers as the sales person from April to September, 2012.

Other positions held by the nominee include; Chairperson of the Young Bar Association from August, 2022 to December, 2024; Director, Legal Affairs at the Universities and College Students' Peace Association of Kenya from January, 2016 to 2020; Trans-Nzoia Youth Representative at the East African Youth Parliament from

2015 to 2016; Vice-chairperson, Students Organization at Moi University, School of Law from 2014 to 2015; Basketball Captain at Moi University School of Law from 2013 to 2015 and as Class Representative at Moi University School of Law from 2013 to 2014.

Income and net worth

The nominee stated his net worth to be approximately Kshs. 30 million. He submitted that he is currently the Managing Partner of Oringe Waswa & Opany Advocates. He informed the Committee that his sources of wealth are:

- Outstanding Legal Fees estimated at Kshs. 10 Million
- Property in Luhkuna , Kiminini and Nabiswa worth Kshs. 10 Million
- Three motor vehicles worth Kshs. 10 Million

Professional Associations and Membership

The nominee is a member of African Bar Association, the Law Society of Kenya, Young Parliamentarians Association, Certified Mediators of Kenya and The Young Bar Association where he served as Chairperson from 2022 to 2024.

Potential Conflict of Interest

The nominee indicated that should a conflict of interest arise while in office, he would drop any case that would conflict with the discharge of any duties of the office of County Attorney.

Pro-bono/Charity Work

The nominee has been involved in offering pro bono services on land cases involving the tussle for land between squatters and the Kenya Army in Eldoret Military Base. He further submitted that he handled the Endebess squatters tussle on pro-bono basis.

Integrity

The nominee submitted that he has neither been charged in a court of law nor mentioned in any investigatory reports of Parliament or any Commission of Inquiry in the last three (3) years. The nominee has also never been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution.

4.1 SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

The Committee posed several questions to the nominee on his suitability for appointment as follows:

On values and principles of the public service as outlined in Article 232 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010

The nominee informed the Committee that the principles include integrity, accountability, transparency and fairness. He stated that public officers should uphold high ethical standards in their conduct and decision making. Regarding transparency, the nominee emphasized the importance of making public information accessible, timely and accurate.

On duties of the County Attorney

The nominee informed the Committee that the County Attorney is the Principal Legal advisor to the County Executive. He also stated that the County Attorney represents the County Executive in civil matters.

On litigation in Bungoma County and high cost of Legal Fees/pending Legal Fees owed by the County Executive

The nominee submitted that he would conduct a legal audit to determine cases that require application of alternative dispute resolution mechanisms and those that will proceed to full hearing. These approaches can lead to more efficient, cost-effective, and amicable outcomes compared to prolonged court processes.

The nominee further underscored the need to comply with the principles of the Advocates Remuneration Order; which provides for remuneration of an advocate of the High Court by his client in contentious and non-contentious matters.

The nominee also informed the Committee that should there be a matter that requires procurement of legal services by the County Government, he would engage in negotiations on the legal fees to be charged for such services; and within budgetary provisions before engaging an external advocate.

On non-compliance by the appointing authority with the legal advice provided

The nominee stated that as the County Attorney, he ought to provide sound legal advice to the County Executive at all times. He stated that when called upon by his

appointing authority to provide such advice, he would offer documented and impartial advice.

On Commitment to Legal Compliance and Intergovernmental Collaboration

The nominee stated that he would provide guidance to the County Executive Departments to ensure adherence to established legal provisions regarding content and timelines for matters with legal implications. He also informed the Committee that he would maintain regular consultations with the County Assembly on issues of mutual interest between the two arms of government.

Regarding his litigation history

The nominee stated that he had successfully litigated over 80% of the cases handled in his private practice.

On the objectives of civic education

The nominee informed the Committee that civic education is intended to enlighten the public on current affairs and to promote public participation in decision-making

Regarding legal pitfalls relating to Public Finance Management

The nominee stated that key challenges affecting Public Finance Management and service delivery in public entities include the presence of ghost workers, mismanagement of funds, favoritism, and conflicts of interest. He pledged to ensure compliance with relevant legal provisions related to service delivery; particularly in the areas of human resource management and procurement, if given the opportunity to serve.

On principles to be observed by the County Public Service Board during the exercise of its disciplinary powers

The nominee informed the Committee that, in exercising disciplinary powers, it is essential to uphold the principles of natural justice and fairness. He stated that all parties involved should be given adequate time and opportunity to present witnesses and pursue their case. He also emphasized the importance of the County Public Service Board maintaining consistency in its decision making.

On key principles governing the Procurement Policy

The nominee stated that the principles of transparency, accountability, non-discrimination, fairness and the rule of law should be observed during the tendering process.

Regarding matters that are taken into account when making appointments to the County Public Service

The nominee informed the Committee that merit and principles under Article 10 and 232 of the Constitution should be taken into account when making appointments to the County Public Service. The nominee also stated that for consideration for appointment, an individual's integrity should be beyond reproach.

5.0 COMMITTEE GENERAL OBSERVATIONS ON THE SUITABILITY OF THE NOMINEE

The Committee having considered, the nominee's filled questionnaire pursuant to Section 6(8) of the Public Appointments (County Assembly Approval) Act, 2017, his curriculum vitae; and having heard his oral submissions during the approval hearing, made the following observations:

- 1) **THAT**, the nominee meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 on Leadership and Integrity.
- 2) **THAT**, the nominee has not been charged in a court of law in the past three (3) years.
- 3) **THAT**, the nominee has never been dismissed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution for contravention of the Provisions of Article 75(1) (conflict of interest) and Article 76 (financial probity).
- 4) **THAT**, the nominee was admitted to the Roll of Advocates on 28th June, 2018 thus the nominee meets the requirements under Section 5 (2) on the qualifications for appointment as County Attorney.
- 5) **THAT**, the nominee is in good standing with his professional body; he presented to the Committee a current practicing certificate for the year 2025.
- 6) **THAT**, the nominee **demonstrated** knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the position to which he had been nominated to; and **had** the requisite abilities, academic qualifications and professional experience to be approved for appointment.
- 7) **THAT**, the nominee's average assessment score was **74.63%**.





6.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION
