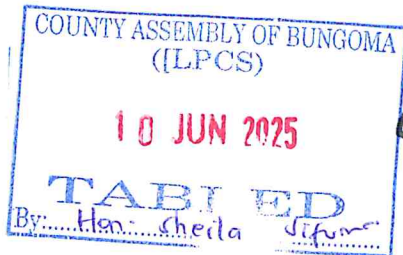

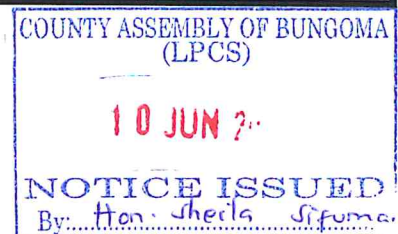
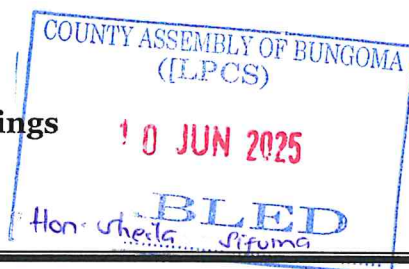


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CHAPTER ONE

1.1 Preamble

Mr. Speaker,

It is my duty to present the report by the Committee on Labour Relations, Members Service and Facilities on the County Assembly Service Board and County Public Service Board 1st and 2nd Quarter Financial Statements for the Financial Year 2024/25 for the period ended 31st December, 2024. The Financial Statements was tabled on 5th March, 2025 in the County Assembly of Bungoma and stood committed to all Sectoral Committees for their interrogation, input and recommendation through a report to this Honorable House.

1.2 Committee Mandate

Mr. Speaker,

The Sectoral Committee on Labour Relations, Members Service and Facilities is constituted pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 217 of the County Assembly of Bungoma and has executed its mandate in accordance with number (5) of the aforementioned Standing Order that provides:

- (a) investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments;*
- (b) study the programme and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;*
- (c) study and review all county legislation referred to it;*
- (d) study, assess and analyze the relative success of the departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;*
- (e) investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the County Assembly;*
- (f) to vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 208 (Committee on Appointments); and*

(g) Make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

1.4 Guiding principles in the Examination of the Bungoma County Government Quarterly Reports and Financial statements.

Mr. Speaker,

In the execution of its mandate, the Committee on Labour Relations, Members Service and Facilities is given a legal backing under the Constitution of Kenya 2010, Public Finance Management Act, 2012, County Governments Act, 2012. These statutory provisions include:

1. Constitutional Principles on Public Finance

Article 201 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 enacts fundamental principles that ***“...shall guide all aspects of public finance in the Republic...”*** These principles include, *inter alia*, that: **201(a)** *There shall be openness and accountability, including public participation in financial matters;* **201(d)** *Public money shall be used in a prudent and responsible way;* and **201(e)** *Financial management shall be responsible, and fiscal reporting shall be clear.*

Section 149(1) (a) and (b) of the PFM Act 2012 provides as follows... *“an accounting officer is accountable to the County Assembly for ensuring that the resources of the entity for which the officer is designated are used in a way that is;*

- a) Lawful and authorized*
- b) Effective, efficient, economical and transparent”*

2. Direct Personal Liability

Article 226(5) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 is emphatic that *“If the holder of a public office, including a political office, directs or approves the use of public funds contrary to law or instructions, the person is liable for any loss arising from that use and shall make good the loss, whether the person remains the holder of the office or not”*.

3. Obligations of Accounting Officers

The Public Finance Management Act, 2012 section 166 states as follows;

- 1. An accounting officer for a county government entity shall prepare a report for each quarter of the financial year in respect of the entity.*
- 2. In preparing a quarterly report for a county government entity, the accounting officer shall ensure that the report—*
 - (a) contains information on the financial and nonfinancial performance of the*

entity; and

(b) is in a form determined by the Accounting Standards Board.

3. *Not later, than fifteen days after the end of each quarter, the accounting officer shall submit the quarterly report to the County Treasury.*

4. *Not later than one month after the end of each quarter, the County Treasury shall—*

(a) consolidate the quarterly reports and submit them to the county assembly;

(b) deliver copies to the Controller of Budget, National Treasury and the Commission on Revenue Allocation; and


(c) publish and publicize them

CHAPTER TWO

2.1 KEY HIGHLIGHTS ON THE HALF YEAR FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2024/2025.

2.1.1 THE COUNTY PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD

Mr. Speaker,

The County Public Service Board of had a total approved allocation of Kshs. 65,928,430 which was distributed as Kshs. 49,910,124 on recurrent and Kshs. 16,018,306 on development.

2.1.1.1 REVENUE

Mr. Speaker,

The Board does not collect any revenue and AIA. A total of Kshs 15,702,414 was realized as exchequer release towards recurrent and Kshs. 8,000,000 was towards development as at the end of the period under review.

2.1.1.2 EXPENDITURE

Mr. Speaker,

The total expenditure budget for the period was Kshs 14,378,323.46 representing 21.8% total budget absorption;

Under Recurrent, the allocation of Kshs. 49,910, 124 had an expenditure of Kshs. 14,378,323.46 (28.8%) on the following votes:

- Human resource management (Basic salary, pension and promotions) had an allocation of Kshs. 11,712,720 with absorption of Kshs. 5,481,139.11 this absorption represents 46.8% of the salary vote.
- Communication supplies services with an allocation of Kshs. 381,714 had an expenditure of Kshs. 186,724.15 (49%)
- Domestic Travel and Subsistence with an allocation of Kshs. 11,511,341 had an expenditure of Kshs. 2,193,015 (19%). The expenditure includes Kshs. 1,500,000

as facilitation to carryout authentication of academic and professional documents and Kshs. 415,140 paid as a pending bill to African Touch Safaris Ltd

- Advertising services with an allocation of Kshs. 1,072,354 had an expenditure of Kshs. 183,280 (17%)
- Training expenses with an allocation of Kshs. 3,257,658 had an expenditure of Kshs. 599,311.85 (18%)
- Hospitality with an allocation of Kshs. 11,952,609 had an expenditure of Kshs. 4,504,500 (38%)
- Fuel oil and lubricants with an allocation of Kshs. 1,513,043 had an expenditure of Kshs. 756,521 (50%)
- Legal fees with an allocation of Kshs. 1,798,000 had an expenditure of Kshs. 469,522 (26%)
- Purchase of office furniture with an allocation of Kshs. 554,000 had an expenditure of Kshs. 4,310.35
- Insurance Cost, Office and General Supplies Services and routine maintenance of other assets had no expenditures during the period under review.

2.1.1.3 BUDGET EXECUTION BY PROGRAMS AND SUB-PROGRAMS

Mr. Speaker,

Development

During the period under review, the Board spent Kshs. 8,000,000 from an allocation of 16,018,306 towards construction of administration block.

2.1.1.4 ACCOUNTS PAYABLE

Mr Speaker,

The accounts payable at the beginning of the financial year amounted to Kshs. 18,727,363.30. Out of the amount, the Board paid Kshs. 929,436 towards recurrent

while Kshs. 8,000,000 was development and relates to the construction of the Board's office block. At the end of the period under review, the board had outstanding accounts payable of Kshs. 9,797,927.60.

2.1.1.5 ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE.

Mr. Speaker,

The County Public Service Board had cleared and had one unsurrendered imprest which relates to standing office imprest of Ksh. 300,000 that is usually surrendered at the end of the Financial Year.

2.1.2 THE COUNTY ASSEMBLY SERVICE BOARD.

2.1.2.1 REVENUE

Mr. Speaker,

The total budget for County Assembly for the financial year 2024/25 is Kshs. 1,356,950,433 as per the approved annual budget comprising of a total of Kshs. 1,166,950,433 Recurrent budget and Kshs. 190,000,000 towards Development.

2.1.2.2 EXPENDITURE

Mr. Speaker,

The total receipt for the period was Kshs. 402,095,610 which includes Kshs. 392,095,984 exchequer release and Kshs. 9,999,626 paid by County Executive on behalf of the County Assembly (The submitted figures from Treasury for this is Kshs. 9,549,626, a variance of Kshs. 450,000). From the receipts, the expenditure amounted to Kshs. 447,771,996 representing 33% total budget.

2.1.2.3 BUDGET EXECUTION BY PROGRAMMES AND SUB-PROGRAMS

Mr. Speaker,

Under recurrent, the allocation of Kshs. 1,166,950,433 had an expenditure of Kshs. 447,771,996 (38%) on the following votes:

- Compensation to employees with an allocation of Kshs. 538,627,763 had an expenditure of Kshs. 250,087,980. This absorption represents 46.4% of the salary vote.
- Utilities, supplies and services with an allocation of Kshs. 2,750,000 had an expenditure of Kshs. 1,252,332 (46%)
- Communication supplies services with an allocation of Kshs. 6,997,000 had an expenditure of Kshs. 859,850(12%)

- Domestic Travel and Subsistence with an allocation of Kshs. 123,197,900 had an expenditure of Kshs. 66,130,245 (54%).
- Foreign Travel and Subsistence with an allocation of Kshs. 6,000,000 had an expenditure of Kshs. 2,675,896 (45%).
- Printing and Advertising services with an allocation of Kshs. 12,356,000 had an expenditure of Kshs. 864,499 (7%)
- Training expenses with an allocation of Kshs. 65,528,285 had an expenditure of Kshs. 23,656,939 (36%)
- Hospitality with an allocation of Kshs. 58,723,784 had an expenditure of Kshs. 17,083,652 (29%)
- Insurance costs with an allocation of Kshs. 51,005,383 had an expenditure of Kshs. 24,185,031 (47%)
- Specialized materials with an allocation of Kshs. 7,916,500 had an expenditure of Kshs. 777,600 (10%)
- Other operating expenses with an allocation of Kshs. 127,831,755 had an expenditure of Kshs. 53,357,463 (42%)
- Office general supplies with an allocation of Kshs. 18,620,040 had an expenditure of Kshs. 4,283,412 (23%)
- Fuel oil and lubricants with an allocation of Kshs. 5,700,000 had an expenditure of Kshs. 1,370,000 (24%)
- Routine maintenance of vehicles and other transport equipment with an allocation of Kshs. 10,162,000 had an expenditure of Kshs. 462,832 (5%)
- Routine maintenance of other assets with an allocation of Kshs. 15,634,323 had an expenditure of Kshs. 581,250 (4%)

Under Development, the allocation of Kshs. 190,000,000 had an expenditure of Kshs. 58,705,434 (31%) which was for the construction of the Debating chambers.

2.1.2.4 ACCOUNTS PAYABLES

Mr. Speaker,

As at December, 31st 2024, the trade payables amounted to Kshs. 148,004,587, broken down as follows;

- a. Trade payables – Kshs. 116,037,703
- b. Employee payables – Kshs. 29,677,751
- c. Other payables (tax arrears) – 2,289,133

CHAPTER THREE

3.1 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

3.1.1 Committee's Observations.

Mr. Speaker,

The Committee made the following observations.

1. The construction of the County Public Service Board (CPSB) office block is currently at 20% completion. The project has stalled due to delayed payments amounting to Kshs. 3.7 million, as indicated in the payment certificate raised.
2. As of 31st December 2024, the County Treasury had not reported an expenditure of Kshs. 8,000,000 incurred on the construction of the CPSB office block.
3. During the review period, it was noted that neither the County Assembly Service Board nor the County Public Service Board had any outstanding imprests. The only imprest recorded was a standing imprest of Kshs. 300,000 under the CPSB, which is duly cleared at the end of every financial year.
4. The Treasury reported having lent Kshs. 9,549,626 to the County Assembly Service Board. However, the actual amount should have been Kshs. 9,999,626, resulting in a variance of Kshs. 450,000. The discrepancy pertains to expenditure on fuel, oil, and lubricants.
5. It was observed that certain votes registered low absorption rates as at the end of the second quarter of the 2024/25 Financial Year.



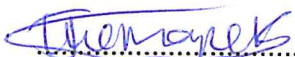

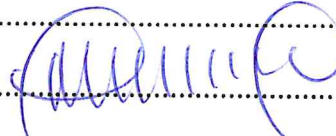


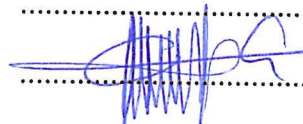


3.1.2 Committee's Recommendations
Mr. Speaker,

The following recommendations were made by the Committee:

1. **THAT** the County Treasury should expedite the payment of the outstanding certificate amounting to Kshs. 3.7 million. This will facilitate the return of the contractor to the site and support the timely completion of the CPSB office block, thereby avoiding potential penalties and contract variations.
2. **THAT**, the County Treasury should actively collaborate with the respective user departments to ensure the accuracy and completeness of financial reporting to prevent instances of misreporting in the financial statements.
3. **THAT**, both the County Assembly Service Board (CASB) and the County Public Service Board (CPSB) should enhance budget execution and strive to attain a minimum absorption rate of 50% across all vote heads by the end of the second quarter of the Financial Year.

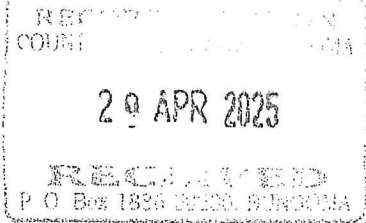

COUNTY PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD

NOTES ON THE 1ST AND 2ND QUARTERLY EXPENDITURE REPORT

The County Public Service Board during the financial year 2024/2025 implemented a recurrent budget of ksh.49,910,124 with allocation on development vote of Ksh. 16,018,306. This was against a submitted financial requirement of Ksh.86,046,605 recurrent while ksh.38,395,500 on development votes respectively.

Below is the analysis on how the approved estimates were implemented during the period ended 31st December 2024.

1. EXCHAQUER RELEASES

A total of kshs.15,702,414 was released under recurrent vote and Ksh. 8,000,000 under Development vote inform of expenditure during the 1st and 2nd quarters ended 31st December 2024 and expensed accordingly with regard to Boards programs activities.

2. EXPENDITURE ON PERSONNEL EMOLUMENTS

Of the above releases, Ksh. 1,061,962 was expensed on personnel emoluments as salaries and allowances during the 1st quarter while Ksh. 5,747,567 was utilized on the same during the 2nd quarter. This brought a total expenditure on personnel ksh.6,809,540 for the entire period.

3. STATUS OF ONGOING PROJECTS/FLAGSHIP PROJECTS

The Board in the current financial year 2024/2025 was allocated kshs. 16,018,306 towards construction of administration block, this is against contract sum of kshs. 52,497,282.94. By the end of the 2nd quarter, the project was at the formation stage having been paid to the tune of Ksh. 8,000,000.

5. PENDING BILLS SETTLED/OUTSTANDING

The Board at the start of the financial year 2024/2025 brought forward a total of Kshs. 18,727,363.30 pending bills due to suppliers. However, due to financial constraints, we managed to pay kshs. 929,436 recurrent whereas Ksh. 8,000,000 for development. The amount outstanding in terms of pending bills as at the end of the 2nd quarter is Kshs. 9,797,927.60.

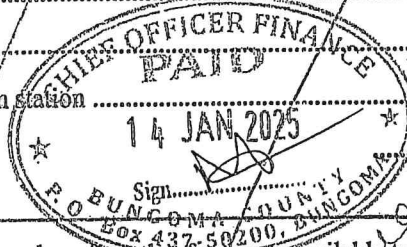

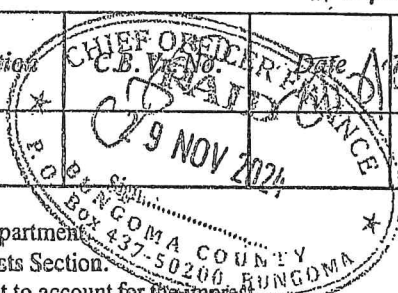
