4. State whether all ECDE teaching and learning materials and vocational training equipment have been delivered to the respective centres
5. Measures the Department has taken to ensure full delivery of the undelivered ECDE materials and when this will be completed.
6. Provide a comprehensive status update on items procured for Ksh. 19,488,668 budgeted for equipping vocational training centres across the county.
7. Measures the Department has taken to prevent future delay in the procurement and distribution of ECDE teaching and learning materials and vocational training equipment.
