8. **MOTION** - **THE NOMINATION AND APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS TO THE COUNTY PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD SELECTION PANEL PURSUANT TO SECTION 58A OF THE COUNTY GOVERNMENTS ACT, 2012** (Revised 2020).

*(Leader of the Majority Party)*

**AWARE THAT**, Section 58A(1) of the County Governments Act, 2012 (Revised 2020) provides that whenever a vacancy arises in the County Public Service Board (CPSB), the Governor shall nominate and, with the approval of the County Assembly, appoint members to a Selection Panel for the purpose of selecting suitable candidates for appointment as members of the CPSB;

**FURTHER AWARE THAT**, Section 58 A (2) of the same Act provides that the Selection Panel shall consist of the following five (5) persons—

- a) a chairperson, not being a public officer;
- b) one person from the private sector;
- c) an Advocate of the High Court of Kenya, who is a member of the Law Society of Kenya;
- d) an accountant who is a member of the Institute of Certified Public Accountants of Kenya; and
- e) one person from an association representing workers;

**NOTING THAT**, Section 58 A (3) provides that in nominating members to the Selection Panel, the Governor shall ensure that not more than two-thirds of the nominees are of the same gender;

**COGNIZANT THAT**, vide a letter dated 6<sup>th</sup> August, 2025 to the Speaker, the Governor submitted the names of five (5) nominees as follows:

1. CS Elizabeth Wanyonyi - Chairperson
2. Advocate Saul Wasilwa - Representing LSK
3. CPA Rita Nabalayo Manyonge – Member, ICPAK
4. Chemonges Stephen - Representing Workers' Association
5. Julius Bakasa – Representing the Private Sector

**APPRECIATING THAT**, the nominations complies with the gender rule as required under Section 58A (3), and that the five nominees meet the statutory and professional requirements stipulated in law;

**NOW THEREFORE**, this House resolves to approve the following five (5) nominees to serve in the Selection Panel for the recruitment of members to the County Public Service Board:

Statement No. 16/2025 **Member for Mbakalo Ward (Hon. Benard Kikechi – MCA) to get a response from the Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Education and Vocational Training** in

respect to the budgetary implementation on the programme of teaching and learning materials for early childhood development (ECDE) and equipping of vocational training centres in the Department. In the statement, let the Chairperson inquire into and report on the following:

1. The procurement process; advert, evaluation report, professional opinion and inspection report of the delivered material and equipment.
2. Criteria used in the distribution of ECDE teaching and learning materials and vocational training equipment for each centre.
3. Provide a full itemized report and verification of delivery status for each item listed under the ECDE materials budget totalling ksh. 20.6 million, including quantities delivered to centres and current usage status.
4. State whether all ECDE teaching and learning materials and vocational training equipment have been delivered to the respective centres
5. Measures the Department has taken to ensure full delivery of the undelivered ECDE materials and when this will be completed.
6. Provide a comprehensive status update on items procured for ksh. 19,488,668 budgeted for equipping vocational training centres across the county.
7. Measures the Department has taken to prevent future delay in the procurement and distribution of ECDE teaching and learning materials and vocational training equipment.
8. Any other information deemed necessary.
