Mr. Deputy Speaker: Very well. That is a motion by the Committee on Health.

(Loud consultations)

Committee on Health, can be upstanding members.

Order Members! Hon. Chikati Chitekei, you are shouting; you are heckling. Hon. Mating'i Order! Please Hon. Barasa Khaoya

Hon. Tony Barasa: Honorable Speaker, I want to rise on a point of Order, and I think Kabeyi help me the Standing Order on the House quorum.

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Which Standing Order?

Hon. Tony Barasa: I think thirty something and that is why I have requested Honorable Speaker.

(Laughter)

There is no information; I'm on a point of order. Hon. Speaker on the issues of House Quorum, the Standing Order is very clear that we ring a bell for some time to achieve a quorum, so that we can proceed... We are not in a committee; we are in the House.

(Loud consultations)

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Order members!

Hon. Tony Barasa: Honorable Speaker, that is Standing Order No. 34; on adjournment of the House. A member may at a time if there are reasons stated to seek leave to move that the House to now adjourn for the purpose that we don't have the House quorum.

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(Loud consultations)

Mr. Deputy Speaker: That is not the right Standing Order.

(Loud consultations)

Hon. Tony Barasa: No!

(Loud consultations)

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Order! Hon. Khaoya you are out of order! Resume your seat!

(Loud consultation)

Hon Khaoya resume your seat.

Hon Tony Khaoya: Honorable Speaker...

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Order! Hon. Khaoya, you are out of order! Resume your seat.

Hon. Tony Khaoya: Honorable Speaker...

(Loud consultations)

Mr. Deputy Speaker: You are out of order Hon. Tony! Yes Hon. Ipara.

(Loud consultations)

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Hon. Chitekei, you are out of order! Can you resume your seat Hon. Chitekei. Hon. Ipara proceed.

Hon. Johnston Ipara: Thank you, Honorable Speaker for protecting me from Hon. Chikati. I don't know why Chikati has that tendency. I'm rising on this issue because Hon. Tony Khaoya was trying to mislead the House. The issue that came first as a precedence was the quorum of the committee and I don't know why he likes to ambush the Honorable Speaker, every time that you are about to make a decision, he rises up. What is his intention and he knows very well that the issue the Honourable members had raised and he was the first person to come to this House and he never saw the quorum of the House and what we have seen is that the committee does not have members.

(Applause)

(Loud consultations)

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Order members! Let us have Hon. Chitekei who was online. Hon Chitekei, proceed

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Hon. Timothy Chikati: Secondly, he is misleading the House by telling us Standing Order No. 34 while it is no. 38 and he is a senior member of this House while having the Standing Order in his hands...

(Loud consultations)

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Order members. Hon. Khaoya Order! Members before Hon. Makari, Honorable members this is a House of rules and procedures. When you go on HANSARD quoting an erroneous Standing Order you cannot take it back.

Hon. Tony Barasa: I acknowledge it Honorable Speaker...

Mr. Deputy Speaker: So you are out of order...

(Loud consultations)

(Applause)

We are past that stage. We are a democratic House and we have to hear people and they have to converse. Honourable members, let us not go back to the issue of Standing Order and everything because already there is a problem. So Hon. Makari, you are an elder and a leader, so what are you informing the House, because we want to pronounce ourselves on the issue of the Committee Membership. That is where we are.

(Loud consultation)

Hon. Khaoya Order!

Hon. George Makari: Honorable Speaker, I'm the Chair - Committee of Health and...

(Loud consultations)

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Hon. Mating'i Order! You are heckling.

Hon. George Makari: *(On a point of Information)* I want to believe that there is an ambiguity in the Standing Orders. Why? First of all, it should be the quorum of the House then second, it should be the quorum of the members of the committee.

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Hon. Makari, I gave you chance. I called you an elder and you are taking another route. Can you resume your seat.

(Applause)

Hon. Makari is being mischievous. I know him. When I am seated here, I am raised and you know that. So if there was no one Hon. Makari to raise me about the quorum of the House, I didn't see it and we proceeded with other Orders because everyone was comfortable. So, it

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should not come to that. We have stepped down the issue on Tourism, Roads and now we are asking that the Committee on Health to stand, so that we get the quorum then some hitch comes Hon. Makari. So let us have the committee members of Health standing to attain the quorum.

(Loud consultations)

Order members! Hon... He is not in so that is the problem. So there is no quorum.

(Applause)

(Loud consultations)

You can resume your seats. So we are taking back the same report to the House Business Committee for rescheduling and it will be given the soonest time possible Hon. Makari because you are always a very serious chair. Being given the soonest time is because of your character and behavior. You have been always a good man unlike Hon. Tony Barasa who is very stubborn.
